Snippets from Recent Club Programs

December 31 – Bill Flinchbaugh, "Child Car Seat Safety"

Bill of Skyline Kiwanis Club (Longmont) talked about his long involvement with child car seat safety with KPTI, Boulder Community Hospital, and as Executive Director of Colorado's Child's Automobile Safety Association. He noted that car safety seats have been around a long time, but only since 1993 have they had to meet federal performance standards. Because children are getting heavier, he said harnesses on car seats can now hold children up to 65 pounds. The average car seat has a five year life span while car beds used to protect infants have a four year span. The average child, he said, could be in as many as five different car seats before he outgrows them. He estimates in Boulder County 98% of car seats aren't used properly. He spends four to six hours a week at Community Hospital showing parents how to install seats properly. In his time working to promote car seat safety, he has seen a 50% reduction in injuries when car seats are used properly.



January 11 -- Josh Pace, "Bicycles for Humanity (B4H)"

Josh made a very interesting presentation on the work his organization does to collect and deliver used bicycles to Africa where they are used for transportation and delivery of vital medical supplies. Since the nonprofit organization was founded in 2007, it has delivered 1,000 bicycles to two communities in Namibia, a country in southwestern Africa. Not only do they ship them, but the shipping container is trucked to the village and, after some alterations, becomes the bicycle shop for that community. The bikes sell for from \$5 to \$50, and villagers are taught to repair and maintain the bikes so that a new business is started. A certain percentage of the bikes are donated to mobile health care delivery workers. Namibia has a serious problem with HIV-AIDS and the bikes are used to deliver medicine to persons suffering from HIV-AIDS. This year they plan to ship 1,000 bicycles and expect to add a third village to the program. B4H partners with the Bicycle Empowerment Network Namibia to cut red tape and get timely delivery of the bikes. Josh says B4H is always on the lookout for used bikes.
