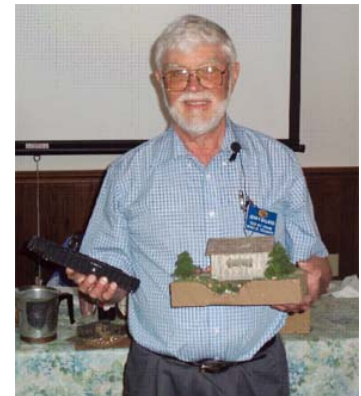

MINUTES: May Board minutes were approved as presented.

TREASURER’S REPORT: The May treasurer’s report was presented and approved.

SECRETARY’S REPORT: The Board approved Mohling’s request for a LOA continuance until July 15.

OLD BUSINESS: Girard and Lefferdink will send a letter to Gerson regarding his lack of attendance and participation in Club activities, and ask for a reply whether he wishes to remain a member of Foothills. A no-response will be construed as permission to drop him from the Club roster.

--Person and Hassler will be in contact with a counselor at Boulder High before the start of school in the fall regarding a new Key Club.

--A motion was approved to have the proceeds from the Boulder Bolder to be given to Team River Runner as proposed at the last Board meeting.

NEW BUSINESS: A request from Rocky Mountain District for money to send Key Club representatives to International Conference was not approved. The Board confirmed an earlier motion to keep funds for Key Club members limited to the Boulder/Monarch high schools.

--Wood reported that members and friends of the Club would be needed to help collect contributions at the annual July 4th fireworks display.

--Lefferdink suggested that one possible way to help socialize the Club members would be to honor members’ birthdays once a month. He will bring the idea to the Club’s meeting.

--The Board confirmed an earlier motion that speakers who want to speak to the Club, but were likely to attempt to sell their business product, would not be allowed as a Club meeting speaker.

--Brown reported that applications were being received for the annual Club scholarship.

The Board adjourned at 7:55 am.
