Snippets from Recent Club Programs

March 6 – Erin Wright & Heather Beasley, Boulder Theater Ensemble Company

Erin and Heather spoke to us about the Boulder Theater Ensemble Company which includes 27 members and performs primarily at the Boulder Dairy Arts Center. They also partner with the Denver Center for the Performing Arts, Lonetree Center, and Fiske Planetarium. The Company is in its 11th Season of providing unique



performances with an emphasis in supporting plays written by female playwrights. “Silent Sky” is their last production of the season running April 6-30 at the Dairy. Call for tickets at 303-444-SEAT. There will be five plays next season including the world premiere of “Birds of North America.” Others are “The Revolutionists,” “Every Christmas Story Ever Told (and then some!)”, “Guards at the Taj,” and “Going to a Place Where You Already Are.”

March 13 – Cliff Bosley, Bolder Boulder Update

Cliff gave our members a 2016 race summary and some tidbits of race plans for the upcoming 39th Memorial Day 10k Road Race. In 2016 there were 42,210 runners who finished the race with an estimated impact of \$10M to the Boulder economy. He explained that it takes 2,900 volunteers, and surprisingly, of all things, over 100 rolls of duct tape to make the race happen. Bolder Boulder is the fourth largest road race in the US; however, it is the largest of all Memorial Day celebrations. A dozen foreign countries provide runners that participate in the professional race; over \$160K is paid to winning professional teams and racers. There are still 62 of the citizen racers who have run all 38 races. Planning for the 2017 race started the day after the 2016 event was completed. Cliff explained that his team is assisting CSU and the city of Fort Collins to plan their first Labor Day “Fortitude” 10k race. They expect 10,000 runners for the first annual race that ends in their new football stadium. Thanks, Cliff, for an interesting presentation!
