

Snippets from Recent Club Programs

June 18 – Bill Myers and Jessica Shannon, Mental Health Partners

Bill and Jessica talked about the Mental Health Partners organization that started in 1962 as a small clinic, received non-profit status in 1964, and was federally designated as a community mental health center for the Boulder area in 1971. Patient facilities are located in Boulder, Broomfield, and Longmont. It offers 24-hour emergency psychiatric services and outpatient offices for





infants, children, adolescents, adults, and families. Many programs and services are available including school-based programs, substance abuse treatment, rape crisis counseling, advocacy, and education. It's estimated that of the some 360,000 residents of Boulder and Broomfield counties, over 60,000 of these suffer with some form of mental illness. Annually, Mental Health Partners serves over 18,000 people, and its Emergency Psychiatric Services Team responds to over 10,000 calls. It serves more women than men, and thirty-six percent of its clients are multicultural.
