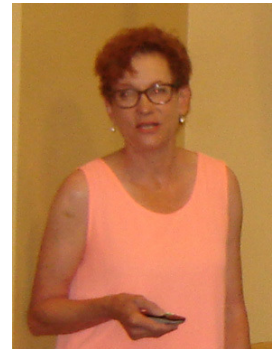

Snippets from Recent Club Programs

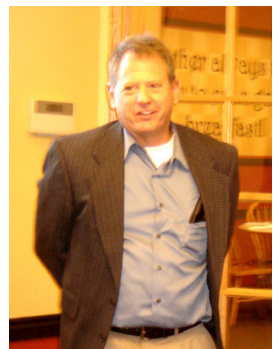
August 24 – Ann Marie, Author of “Letters to Ann” (Korean War collection of letters)


Ann Marie talked about her book “Letters to Ann: The Korean War 1950-51” about the letters written by Army medical officer Captain John Hughes to his 4-year-old daughter Ann. He used illustrations and simple words in his letters to give Ann to tell her about his duties and the Korean culture. Ann included maps, photos, and command reports from the U.S. Medical Service Corps expand on the conditions in which Captain Hughes served in several areas of (what is now) South Korea and North Korea. Ann shared some of the photos with us, including of Chosin Reservoir battle areas where over 30,000 Chinese soldiers died due to the severe cold weather. Captain Hughes returned home after the war, and passed away in 1982. Ann began her career in journalism as a television news reporter and morning anchor in Albuquerque, New Mexico, then attended law school and practiced as a trial litigation attorney in Denver. After semi-retiring, she turned to editing and published "Letters to Ann." It is her first book and was a double-winner at the 2014 Colorado Independent Publishers Association EVVY Awards. It received third place for editing and first place for military/military history. Ann’s book can be purchased at local bookstores or Amazon.



August 31 – Cliff Bosley, “Bolder Boulder 10K Race”

Cliff talked about the history and statistical information of the Bolder Boulder 10K Race annually held on Memorial Day that’s the 4th largest running event in the U.S. The first Bolder Boulder was in 1979 organized and led by Cliff’s father Steve as a way to get children interested in running. Soon after, Boulder Olympic marathon champion Frank Shorter worked with Steve to change the event from having less than a thousand children to a running event involving 1000’s of participants of all ages. This past May’s Bolder Boulder had 53,000 participants from all 48 states and 15 countries who ran or walked in 90 waves, supported by 2900 volunteers including our club’s volunteers checking runners/walkers at the starting line. Over the years, technology has been added to allow precise tracking of runner/walker times, combined with a photo taken of each runner as they cross the finish line. Race participants particularly enjoy finishing the race at Folsom Field packed with people, where this year a special Memorial Day program honoring our WWII and other vets was held. At now age 75, Steve Bosley is still involved in post-race analysis to try to improve it even more. The Bolder Boulder brings about \$10 million in revenue every year.

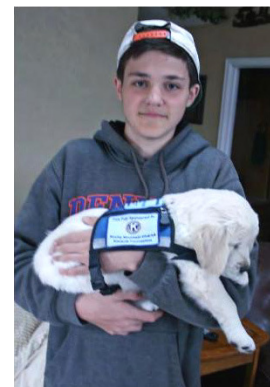
