## Snippets from Recent Club Programs

### January 14 – Bob Mohling, "Cambodia Mission Team Projects"

Bob talked about being on a mission trip with 14 people who went to Cambodia from November 15 -December 1 to lead a youth conference for young people from 12-32 at the Trinity Lutheran church in Battambang, to complete several community projects at Trinity, and to see a few sites such as the Angkor Wat temple. Led by former Cambodians Pastor Peter and Mary Sok, and Pastor Pete and Glenda Scheele, the team was made up of members of three Lutheran churches in Bailey and Broomfield that raised \$10,000 to provide funds for projects the team did in Cambodia, including:



- Helping to teach about Lutheranism
- Helping with Habitat for Humanity (HFH) projects which has a goal of building 300 homes for refugees from Cambodia
- Making improvements at a local HFH community center and putting in a new floor for an elderly couple using only hand labor to move sand/gravel, mix the concrete, and spread the concrete
- Building four latrines with each having multiple tanks and an enclosure
- Teaching women how to make dresses from patterns for weddings and general use
- Helping to teach English at a church that has three paid teachers
- Rebuilding a home for a family in only two days with materials costing only \$750.


The mission team also helped with a Vacation Bible School at two Siem Reap schools. The missionary host Dr. Funghatou Lo currently provides seminary training to students from Laos and Vietnam. Bob also showed scenic photos from Cambodia.

### January 21 -- Capt. Isaias Braga, 2012 Salvation Army Bell-Ringing

Captain Braga spoke to our club about the 2012 Boulder County Salvation Army bell-ringing campaign, with a total raised of \$170,673 through volunteer bell-ringers, as well as by paid “Labor Ready” bell-ringers supplied by the Boulder BridgeHouse homeless-assistance program. Foothills Kiwanis members and those who rang on behalf of our club took in \$16,871 of the total \$25,732 donations collected by volunteers, or **about two-thirds** of donations collected by Boulder County community-service clubs, businesses, and individual volunteers. He also talked about the current situation with poverty in Boulder County, where 7 percent in Broomfield and 12 percent of the 360,000 residents are included in this category.

To help the less fortunate in our community, the Boulder County Salvation Army distributed in December over 600 food boxes, \$5,000 in King Soopers grocery-cards, and 1300 toys and clothes to children to needy families. The Boulder County Salvation Army also conducts a weekly after-school program at their Broomfield facility, attended by about 70 children from ages 5-12. Activities and services include homework tutoring, phonics programs, arts and crafts, sports, a computer lab, video games, seals, and teaching Christian principles. During December, the Boulder County Salvation Army held a Christmas party funded by Wells Fargo and the Broomfield Rotary Club, with a visit by Santa to give out toys to the kids.



Captain Braga thanked our Foothills volunteers for their 363 bell-ringing hours donated this past holiday season, as well as for the total **\$373,986.15** we've collected for the Boulder County Salvation Army from 1997-2012. He presented Foothills Bell-Ringing Project Leader Kerry Hassler with a trophy in recognition of our 2012 bell-ringing efforts, and will add our club's name to the Annual Boulder County Salvation Army Bell-Ringing Award as the 2012 winner. Foothills Kiwanis has won this award for 14 years in a row.
