

<u>6/3/19 – Michael Allen, Rocky Mountain Conservancy</u>

. Michael Allen, originally from Oklahoma, is new with the Conservancy, serving just a couple of months, but he demonstrated that he knows his subject well. The Conservancy (1931) represents the nonprofit part of the Rocky Mountain National Park, which was established in 1915. Its founders hoped to stimulate interest in the park's natural and cultural history. The Conservancy has provided more than \$33 million to the park since 1985. As a nonprofit organization allied with the National Park Service, The Colorado State Parks, the US Forest Service, the Bureau of Land Management, and the US Fish & Wildlife Service, the Conservancy has developed



special programs which include the following: Rocky Mountain National Park Fund (trail rehabilitation), Conservancy Field Institute (outdoor learning adventures), Conservancy Nature Stores (educational & interpretive information), The Next Generation Fund (Junior Ranger program & internships), and Conservancy Conservation Corps (work crews).
