Snippets from Recent Club Programs

7/8/19 – Paul Bailey, Current Selective Service System

Paul Bailey, our club member, is a native of Colorado and has lived in Boulder most of his life; he is a graduate of Boulder High. He spent three years (1994-97) in Saudi Arabia doing computer mapping. Paul spoke to us about his volunteer position on the Selective Service Board; the board has eight members. He explained that the current Selective Service System was set up in 1940 to provide troops for WWII. President Ford stopped it in 1975; President Carter reinstated it in 1980 as a way to be prepared for conflicts. All 18-26 males are required to register. It is important for our national defense, and it has benefits for enrollees: student loan, job training, and makes the signer eligible for all federal jobs. Not registering could also delay citizenship. It is possible to register at the post office as well as on line. 7/15/19 – Craig Hurst, 50th Anniversary of Landing on the Moon

Craig Hurst, our club member, gave a wonderful summary of the Apollo moon landing program. Craig spent his formative years as a military brat as a result of his Dad's 21 year Army career and 16 years with Eastern Airline. Craig was born in France, and attended high school in Miami, FL. He has an ME degree from Auburn, AL. He had a long career in O&G Industry in Operations, Supply Management & Corporate Planning. He worked for Boeing in Seattle area for two years. Craig explained that the space program has been a strong interest of his, and he is concerned that the nation is forgetting the significance and importance of program and its achievements. Craig's presentation included: The Cold War & Space Race, The US Political Timeline, The Programs, "How" to the Moon?, Major Objectives by Program, Launch Vehicles by Program, Apollo Missions - to Apollo 11, Saturn V Performance, Apollo 11 Mission, and Program Costs. The presentation brought back many good memories of a successful US program. I was especially impressed with the heart chart during the Landing of the Eagle. There were no corrections to the June minutes. The minutes were motioned seconded and passed unanimously.

Treasurer's Report.

Joe Girard explained the graph that he sent out on 7/2/19. It shows a downward trend in surplus funds. If the trend continues, the Club will be at zero surplus sometime after this coming November. Joe mentioned that the weekly meeting breakfast with a 20% tip is mainly responsible for the reduction in surplus. It might be worth considering a buffet option which would eliminate the need for a tip. The treasurer's report was motioned, seconded, and passed unanimously.

Old Business

The Club Secretary was asked to update the roster. Mark Czanderna will be moved to **Resigned** status and Waverly Person given **Honorary** status. Both moves will be affective as of July 1st.

Bob Mohling brought up that a program chairman is still needed to handle the last two meetings in August and all of September. Joe Girard volunteered to divide the sessions with Bob and the issue was resolved.

Concerning Membership, Bob Mohling reported that there is a high probability that Diane Sutton (David Petrick's Mom) and Major Mike Paugh will be joining the Foothills Club in August. Eric Warner is likely to join in September.

New Business

President Elect Craig Hurst reviewed thoughts, projects, allocations and timelines. One challenge the Club faces is how to get members excited about championing projects. The logical choice is to make the proposal person the champion. Further discussion is needed on this issue.

The Foothills Kiwanis Club will celebrate its 50th anniversary the 1st Monday in October.
