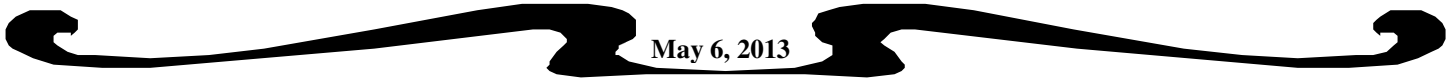

### April 22 – Karen Alfino, STEM Girls Program

Karen told our club members that STEM stands for: **Science, Technology, Engineering, & Math.** The goal of this afterschool organization is: every STEMgirl to consider a career in STEM field. STEMgirls is a 501(c) 3 organization for girls only – ages 8-12, and is offering a summer camp June 17-21, 2013 at The Art Under in Louisville, CO. The cost is \$175 per girl. STEMgirls will build Mars Rovers, create outer space altered books, and explain to June, the therapy dog, why we are looking for life on Mars! STEMgirl Mentors (always female!) will participate in these fun, hands-on activities! Mentoring + fun = STEMgirls summer camp! ### April 29 – Lee Shainis, Intercambio Uniting Communities

Lee Shainis, Executive Director, spoke to our club about Intercambio. It is a nonprofit organization started by Lee and Sawn Camden. When they first started Intercambio, they spent a lot of time searching for high-quality, user-friendly, and affordable adult English language curriculum and cultural training resources. They couldn't find anything that met these requirements, so they spent a decade perfecting a curriculum and additional teaching tools to fit the needs of community-based ESL programs like Intercambio. Its mission is to build understanding, respect and friendship across cultures through educational and intercultural opportunities. It offers: 1) volunteer-taught English classes for adult immigrants, 2) classes and workshops on life skills and citizenship, and 3) cultural trainings and events for all community members. Since 2001, over 8,000 English learning students have participated in Intercambio using the help of over 4,000 volunteer teachers. SECRETARY'S REPORT: The minutes of the April meeting were presented. A motion to approve by Baumann and seconded by Mohling was made and approved.

GENERAL BUSINESS: A motion by Hubbard and seconded by Sprenkle was made for the Club to purchase two copy cards not to exceed \$40 for purpose of printing the bi-weekly Club newsletter. It was suggested that the newsletter be done in black & white instead of colors. Mohling and Gilland will also present an additional yearly statement for printing costs. Passed.
