November 11– Foothills Kiwanis Honors Veterans on Veterans' Day

Our veterans were recognized for their service to our country this 2013 Veterans Day. Our members were asked to provide photos and provide service info for themselves and/or family members. Paul Bailey showed a photo of his grandfather, Dr. George Pierce Bailey, in 1918 at Aberdeen Proving Grounds while training to be an airborne medic. Our WWII vets are:-- Gerald Mordhorst, Waverly Person, and John Shoaf. Gerald served in the US Navy from 1942-44 as an Aviation Machinist and Flight Engineer on PB2Y flying boats. Waverly served in the US Army from 1943-45 in New Guinea, the Philippines, and Japan; and from 1950-1952 in Korea. John served in the US Army during the war in the Aleutian Islands. Other club members and members with family members who served in the military are: Rudi Baumann, Greg Lefferdink (his uncle and aunt), Adam Pauluhn, Bob Mohling, Dave Rogers (and his son-in-law Robb), Mary Schweitzer (her son Paul, nephews, and nieces), and Pete Sprenkle. - Captain Braga talked about this past year's Boulder County Salvation Army programs and activities –
- Christmas 2012 distribution of toys (a few bicycles), clothing, food boxes, and market vouchers to needy families at the Broomfield Salvation Army office
 - Christmas items distributed to 360 families and 1700 total people in Boulder County and Broomfield County
 - Provided first-responder flood- relief to victims of the September 11-13 Boulder-area floods, involving 8,221 hours of service, serving 143,028 meals and nutritional items, and serving 236,943 drinks
 - Forwarded Salvation Army donations to Typhoon Haiyan victims in the Philippines (to donate call -- Call 1-800-SALARMY, or donate on-line at -- at: sar.my/haiyan)

- The only Boulder County Salvation Army staff members who will be bringing new kettles to our sites are Captain Braga and John Hart. If anyone else does this (and for any problems in general), give Captain Braga and call at -- **720-308-5397** -- or call Kerry at -- **303-478-6665**.
- Make sure you wear a red bell-ringing apron that has "Foothills Kiwanis" on it. If you don't find one at the site, call Captain Braga or Kerry.
- Do **not** sign up at the Louisville South Boulder King Soopers site -- this site is reserved for Monarch HS Key Club members.
- This bell-ringing season, the deadline for signing up at a site is **7:00 p.m. the previous day.** If Captain Braga sees via our club website that no one has signed up for the following day, he will then assign paid Salvation Army bellringers to ring at that site for the entire day.
