September 17 - Rudi Baumann, Patagonia Frontiers

Rudi, a charter member of our club, highlighted a recent trip to Argentina and Chile that Sharon and he took February 4-20, 2018. Our special visitor was Mary, a former club member. The trip was sponsored by CU with only 11 travelers. The trip started in Buenos Aires with a tour of the National Fine Arts Museum and the El Teatro Colon Opera House. They traveled to the port of Ushuaia to tour Bahia Lapataia National Park, and embarked on M/V Ventus Australia for four days. It is a new passenger ship that housed 210 passengers. They sailed to Cape Horn, Pia and Aguila glaciers and toured Yamana Settlement. In Patagonia they saw waterfalls, glaciers, lakes, and beautiful mountains. In Chile, the tour included Osarno Volcano, national parks, Valparaiso, and Santiago with its modern buildings. 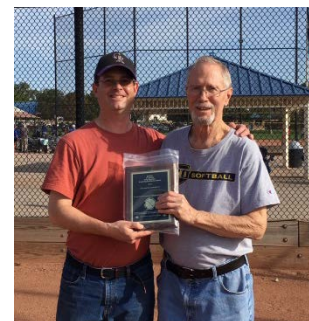
Monarch Key Club Status
