

# Snippets from Recent Club Programs

Sept. 9, 2013

# August 19 – Mary Schweitzer, "Scenes of the Baltic Capital Cities and St. Petersburg"

Foothills Kiwanis member Mary Schweitzer talked about her recent tour to the Baltic capital cities of Villinus (Lithuania), Riga (Lativa), Tallin (Estonia), and the Russian city of St. Petersburg. Her photos included scenes of city and rural areas, cathedrals, local shops, and of museum and street art. One of the most interesting sights was the "Hill of Crosses" in northern Lithuania. Of special note were the people she met and the monuments seen in the Baltic's related to widespread human-rights violations under Soviet government control by Stalin and other Soviet leaders. This included their killing Jews and other minorities, sending



hundreds of thousands of citizens to die in Siberia in over-packed rail cars, and destroying cathedrals, churches, and synagogues. Thankfully, today the Baltic people are living lives free of such tyranny. The sights seen in St. Petersburg included the beautiful art in the Hermitage Winter Palace (home of the Czars), the Church of Our Savior on Spilled Blood (colorful cathedral built where Czar Alexander II was assassinated in 1881), St. Peter and Paul Cathedral (where the last Czar Nicholas II and family killed during the 1917 Russian Revolution are buried), and Catherine I's Summer Palace in the nearby city of Pushikin. ## Jan Arney, Partners in Parenting - Haiti, "Helping Haiti Earthquake Orphans"

Jan talked to our club member about her "Partners in Parenting Haiti" (PIPH) non-profit that places Haitian orphaned or abandoned children in foster homes in the city of Jeremie, Haiti. Jan started PIPH after she visited Haiti with a friend's medical team to help earthquake victims, and decided she had to go back to help needy kids there. PIPH partners with Haitian community representatives to locate foster families and orphans, providing, them funds for food, clothing, shelter, and paying of the child's education and medical expenses. The Haitian PIPH staff visits these families on a regular basis to see that the home conditions,



medical, and educational needs of the orphans are being met. She noted that the kids they sponsor are sent to private schools to get a better education than in public schools, where all children wear the same type of uniform that costs \$60 (a big cost to many families there). Currently, PIPH supports eight foster kids, but hopes to expand to 12 or more next year. SECRETARY'S REPORT: A motion was made by Mohling and seconded by Sprenkle that the minutes of the July 3 meeting and Special electronic minutes be approved. Reports approved.

- -- A motion was made by Mohling and seconded by Sprenkle not to make a donation to Girls' First until more information

(contact, address, champion, etc.) about the organization was made available. Passed.

- -- A motion was made by Mohling and seconded by Sprenkle that the Board approves all fund expenditures before payment is made. President Adam will work with Donation Committee to amend their procedures so no commitment is made for funds until approved by the Board. Passed.
- -- Gilland reported that he will begin to shut down the Dog Project. Someone must take over the project and Gilland will be available for help. No new dogs will be taken in for training. Gilland will continue to finish the training of all dogs presently under training.
