

Snippets from Recent Club Programs

9/25/23 - Virginia Breyer & Carly Marquis, Cultivate (formerly RSVP)

Virginia and Carly informed our members about Cultivate and its mission in our community. Their mission is to engage seniors in their community. Their organization matches individuals 55+ who provide real impact in giving back to their community. They described their top six senior projects: CARRY-OUT CARAVAN provides same day grocery delivery in Broomfield, Boulder and Longmont; FIX-IT installs grab bars and completes minor



home repairs; SNOWBUSTERS pairs neighbors to help shovel sidewalks; VETSGO provides transportation to vets and their family to medical appointments; YARDBUSTERS pairs neighbors to perform basis yard cleanup; and PHONE BUDDY connects people on safety issues. They have a database of 900 volunteers to help 200 senior clients. Background checks are required for volunteers over 18 years of age. Their eight staff are located in Gunbarrel.
