# Snippets from Recent Club Programs

# August 8 -- Jesse Phan, Executive Director of Stronghold Cambodia

Jesse talked about the Stronghold Cambodia ministry he leads in Sihanoukville, Cambodia that helps in-need children and families through educational programs, food assistance, and parent training partnerships. Phsn started his Christian service in small country churches, and received a seminary degree in Singapore, and started Stronghold Cambodia in October 10, 2014. It now has 82 children in both secular and Christian education program, which includes English and computer classes. SC partners with the Cambodia Department of Education to certify its curriculum. There are also



classes for parents to teach them how to help their children with studies at home. Christian education is from 1-5 each day with singing and Bible study. Currently 62 students and SC staff are provided with three meals a day, where many in Cambodia can only afford two meals a day. They are partners with the "Helping Hand" program that provides medical care, clothing, food, and clean water to needy kids and families. Stronghold Cambodia hosts celebrations on June 1 for International Children's Day, and during December for the Christmas Gospel Rally. They are receiving financial support from local churches in Colorado, (such as Risen Savior in Broomfield) Missouri, and other states. Current SC needs include student support (\$40/month), teacher support (\$95 month), bicycles (\$75), photocopy machine (\$900), room for youth ministry (\$1000), and dining room for students (\$2000). # <u>August 15 – Twesigye "Jackson" Kaguri. Leader of Nyaka AIDS</u> <u>Orphans Project in Uganda</u>

Jackson talked about the Nyaka AIDS Orphans Project that helps AIDS/HIV orphans get an education and provides community development programs in southwest Uganda. In 1996, Jackson saw the need for helping orphans in his home village when brother and sister died of AIDS, which led him to start Nyaka using funds he had planned to use to buy a new home. From the initial small group of students who attended the first classes in a simple building with two teachers, today there are 742 students attending classes in the Nyaka complex of eight buildings with 50 teachers for grades 6-12. Some of the teachers are graduates from the first classes that have returned to help children who are in the same situation that they were. Last year, 14 of the Nyaka graduates made it to the university level, including one in medical school. In addition to education, provides health care, shelter, food, and employment (over)

(continued) to locals. Trees are planted around the school to help improve the environment. A medical clinic has just been built to provide health care for the students. All the kids are provided with clean water, and have the opportunity to play sports such as soccer and basketball. The school's library is a resource used by both Nyaka students and others in the community. Students also can learn about computers in a computer lab, where they have recently installed the first wireless-router in that part of Uganda. A vocational school has been started to teach students construction skills and other types of careers. At the end of Jackson's presentation, President Adam presented him and Nyaka school administrator Jennifer with a donation from our club of \$2000.
