Snippets from Recent Club Programs

October 16 – Joe Girard, Nibble on Wisconsin!

Joe Girard gave an impromptu talk on some of the history of the upper Midwest, specifically the old Northwest Territory. Weaving details across time – glacial ages, the explorations of Marquette and Joliet (1673), the Paris Treaty (1783) that ended the war for independence, to slave-free state balance, and the importance of water transportation culminating in the Illinois & Michigan Canal (1848) – he told the story of how the possible great size of the state of Wisconsin came to be whittled down to its rump size when it finally became a state (1848). Historical events such as the first war between states (the Toledo War of 1835) and the completion of the Erie Canal (1825), and the uncertainty of where the southern tip of Lake Michigan lay, all played a part, too. These led to each of the other states of the original NW Territory (OH, IN, IL, MI) – as well as yet-to-be-born Minnesota – causing "bites" out of Wisconsin, producing a greatly diminished final size. Thanks to an observation by Rudi Baumann, the talk also drifted into how Chicago – not Saint Louis – came to be the Queen City of the American west.



October 16 – Liz Cole and Aidah Clinton, Ace Scholarships

Liz and Aidah spoke to our club about Ace Scholarships, a nonprofit organization that raises money from donors and then awards financial scholarships to students from low-income families so they can attend the school of their choice. The organizations vision is: every child has equal access to a quality education. ACE Scholarships has quickly become an educational success story. In fact, since 2000, they have awarded over 23,000 scholarships worth over \$52M, giving children from low-income families the chance to succeed. And succeed they have, graduating high school with most going on to college. Ace students, 100% of whom are low-income, outperform their Colorado public school peers of all incomes in academic measurements. Ace started in Colorado in 2000, but is now also operating in Montana, Wyoming, Nebraska, Louisiana, and Texas. For more information, visit their website at: www.acescholarships.org.

RMD MEMBERSHIP REPORT

- 269 new members added (60% of 448 goal)
- 1 new club opened - Goshen County, WY
- 53 out of 81 clubs added new members
- 172 members sponsored at least 1 new member
- 27 of 81 clubs had a net gain in membership



- Total ending membership on 9/30/17: 2,423
- 380 members deleted.
- Net loss of membership: -112 (-4.4%)
- 5 clubs closed– Steamboat Springs, CO; Loveland Golden K, CO; Montrose, CO; North Platte Valley, NE; Powell, WY
- 40 of 81 clubs had a net loss in membership
- Since 2007, RMD membership declined by 1,707 members (-41%)
