Bill, a Naval Academy graduate and retired schoolteacher, gave us a presentation on technology and how it can help us. He reviewed technology that many in our club are currently using with email, newsletters, website, publishing, meeting

presentations, smartphone communications, text, and phone calls. He challenged us to use more technology from Google: drive, calendar, contacts, email, docs, sheets, and slides. He stated that there are many advantages to using Google: accounts are free, a shared drive can serve as a repository for our Kiwanis work, a Google



account is not necessary, and settings include member editing. There are some disadvantages: control, management and maintenance, and responsibilities and accountability. He recommends that we proceed with using documents and calendar. Let Bill know if you need additional training. International Convention

Bill has just very recently attended the June 21-24 Kiwanis International Convention in Minneapolis. We're grateful that he stepped up to pinch-hit with only one day of notice when our speaker had to postpone. Convention theme: Nurture the Future.

Session on club growth: Use social media; Recruit; Look at meeting options.

Recruiting pitch: make it personal. Why did you join? What do you get out of it?

"Flip" the golden circle. Instead of starting with "what we do", then moving to "how we do it" and then to "why" – reverse it. Tell why for you. Then how and then what.

Voting: Raising Int'l dues by \$30/yr required a 2 /₃ super majority. Only 60% voted "aye", leaving our international dues the same and extending international's ever increasing financial stress at least one more year.

Keynote Speaker: Curt Pulver on mentorship. 5 Cs of mentorship: Confidence, Credibility, Competence, Candor, Care.

Mentor with attitude of Connection and Respect. Four key attributes: Attitude of Contribution, Keep it Simple, Communicate to Collaborate, Listen Wisely.
