Snippets from Recent Club Programs

February 18 - Joe Girard, Treasurer Foothills Kiwanis

Our very own club treasurer, Joe Girard, retired after a serious accident five years ago, and has spent the past two years traveling. Last August, Joe and his wife enjoyed a European Adventure (Erlebnis in German). The trip included a bicycling and hiking tour that was divided into three phases, (1) The Rhineland; (2) The Swiss Alps/Como; and (3) Bavaria. The first phase started in Landau, heart of the Saarland wine country. Highlights included a 40-mile bicycle ride through all the small towns of the region as part of the Erleontstag, Day of Wine. The second phase was a trip through the Alps culminating in a visit to Como, Italy. Lake Como is a beautiful body of water. Along the way, Joe stopped at the Rheinhausen Waterfall. These magnificent falls is the largest by volume in Europe. Lastly, on to hiking and biking in Bavaria. Cows are everywhere in the Bavarian Alps and the region is famous for its mountain cheeses. Along the way, Joe stopped at Wurzburg, a beautiful city on the Main River. The trip took months to plan but was well worth the effort.

Dr. Rob Anderson took over the as superintendent of the Boulder Valley School District following 22 years' experience at every level of public education. Rob came to the BVSD after three years serving as Deputy Superintendent of the Fulton County (Atlanta) School District. Prior to that, Rob was a teacher, department chair, assistant principal, and principal in the Orange County, FL, public-school system. Rob likes to spend as much time as possible in the schools and the communities in the district. Rob believes that great teachers are the key to student success. If the turnover of talented and experienced teachers is kept low, and parent engagement is kept high, student success rises dramatically. In January, Rob kicked off a new strategy. This strategy includes: (1) challenge and engage all students; (2) reduce achievement disparities; and (3) empower students for post graduate success all areas like college, the military, or trade and specialty schools. Rob feels that if the long-term strategy is successful, BVSD can be the leading public-school district in the country and a great source of pride for the Boulder community.
