## Snippets from Recent Club Programs

### June 22 – Mike Fellows, “Meeting at Broomfield Veterans Memorial Museum”

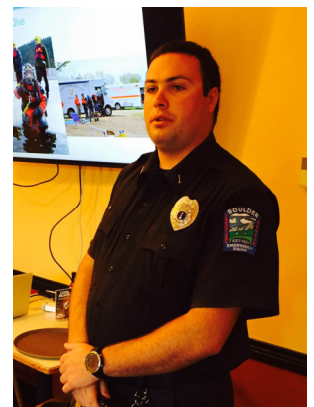
Many of our club members met at the museum to honor our veterans and to celebrate Memorial and Independence Days. Mike Fellows, Museum Director, hosted our meeting at the museum. Mike showed our members 8 mm and 16 mm movies of WWII film taken in Germany. The Broomfield Veterans Memorial Museum seeks to preserve the memories of America’s military history, strengthen the bonds to the community by facilitating the stories of veterans as supported by displays and artifacts for the benefit and education of generations to come. Their vision: a museum that celebrates and honors our veterans’ heritage and works to tell their stories. The museum activities are: Coffee & Conversation, Memorial Day, Veteran’s Day, Broomfield Day, Flag Day, and Veteran’s Honor Board. The July Coffee & Conversation events are:



- July 18 Rocky Mountain Honor Flight – join several veterans who recently participated in an honor flight to Washington DC to see national memorials
- Ann Marie – author of a book of drawings and letters that a young doctor wrote back to his daughter while serving in Korea during the Korean War

### June 29 – Ryan Singer, “Boulder Emergency Squad”

Ryan Singer, Public Affairs Officer, spoke to our club about the Boulder Emergency Squad. He explained that BES is an organization of volunteer rescue professionals who provide technical search, rescue, and other emergency support services to the people of Boulder County and are dedicated to the preservation of life and property. BES was founded by William R. Hughes in 1963 as an emergency radio club, later the 11-Meter Squad, and then first incorporated as BES in 1966. BES is a Colorado member-owned 501.c.3 non-profit entity. There are 55 active volunteers: 37 participate in emergency rescues. Ryan explained that all volunteers train from 8-10 hours/week. BES is located at the Brian D. Dillman Building, conveniently located in North Boulder where the Diagonal Hwy and Foothills Pkwy intersect. The building houses two large conference rooms that are suitable for a variety of purposes. These modern meeting facilities have flexible seating and layout for up to 44 people. 1. Call to Order 7:30 a.m.
2. Review/Approval of Minutes from June Foundation Board Meetings - Approved
3. Treasurer’s Report-Foundation Account June - Approved. Treasurer Gilland explained that he had resolved reconciliation error with the bank of \$145 which was discussed in last month’s minutes. It was approved for Jerry to move excess funds from the Service Dogs account to an interest generating account.
4. General Business
  - a. Golf Tournament - The Board thanked Mohling and Gilland for their hard work on the tournament. They in turn thanked the rest of the club and the golf committee for their help in a successful fundraiser with an estimated final net income of \$13,600 for club projects in our community.
  - b. The Board approved donation of \$1,000 to Sweet Dream in a Bag project which was budgeted.
  - c. Gilland reported that the Club is looking for a new dog food supplier for our Service Dogs for Kids project.
  - d. Mohling reported that thank you letters were sent to golf tournament sponsors. Discussion on whether clarifications for the letter were needed for tax purposes. It was recommended we review this with Baumann.
  - e. Motion was made and seconded to reimburse Mohling and Gilland for \$345 they covered due to Benevity Ball matching funds discrepancy for the golf tournament from the General Fund.
  - f. Discussion on tournament proceeds and which club projects should get additional funds. \$3,000 already transferred to Service Dogs for Kids project. \$1,000 allocated to Project Eliminate. Other funds previously allocated anticipating funds from tournament. There is approximately \$6,000 that the Board will be allocating in the coming months based on club member recommendations and Board approval. Some of these

funds may be carried over to the new Kiwanis year if necessary.

5. Other Business for the Foundation to Consider - None

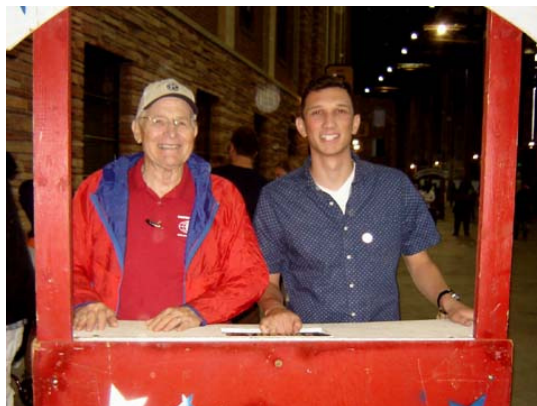

### **Pete Sprenkle Recognized for Years of Leadership and Success with Boulder Girls' Softball Teams**

The annual Boulder Independence Day Tournament is a veritable who's who of the national club softball scene.

This year, possibly the Boulder area's most well-known coach won't be in a dugout or down the third base line for the first time in a long time. After 41 years coaching softball, Boulder Stars head man Peter Sprenkle is hanging it up at 78 years young.

"Clearly I'll miss coaching because coaching is teaching and I like to teach," Sprenkle said. "I'll miss the interaction with the girls and their parents. I like taking care of the field and the clinics and the camps, and I may still continue to do that kind of stuff. My wife and I just decided it was time to take a break."

Sprenkle's granddaughter Julia McCue graduated from Fairview High School in May and is playing with his Boulder Stars for her grandfather's final season. For his final summer, Sprenkle is coaching the Boulder Stars in a more laid-back recreational league without the pressures of college recruiting, frequent travel and a playing 100 games or more. Those of his players who wanted to continue playing club at a more competitive level were free to join other clubs.

While his club was still competing at the highest level, Sprenkle has compiled a record of 1,550-761 to date while coaching at both the club and high school level. The Boulder Stars have won multiple state titles and two years ago finished second out of 65 teams at the Triple Crown World Series in Park City, Utah.

"I've had to opportunity to coach with my daughter and I now go to games and some of the opposing coaches are girls that used to play for me," Sprenkle said. "We've won a lot of games and we've won a lot of tournaments. We've done really well. But what I'll miss most is the time spent with the kids."

Sprenkle founded the Boulder Valley Girls Softball Association in 1978 and has since authored two books including "A Softball Coaches Tool Kit." He is also the recipient of several national softball coaching awards.

Boulder's biggest softball tournament won't be the same without Boulder's most influential softball mind.
