

## Snippets from Recent Club Programs

### 2/24/20 – Chuck Howe, A Trivia Presentation

Chuck, a basketball friend of David, former State Legislator, and District Court Judge, provided us with a fun trivia presentation. He was born in Ft. Lupton, the son of a Kuner canning plant superintendent. He grew up with a fondness for radio serials and basketball. Chuck explained that the point of trivia is for its educational value and the fun that accompanies exploring new knowledge. For adults it exercises mind and memory but also challenges orthodox thinking. For children and grandchildren trivia stimulates curiosity, often entertains and encourages the pursuit and accumulation of worldly knowledge.



Chuck informed us that Google is usually the most reliable source for factspecific information if the right question is asked and one navigates through the responses. Other fertile sources include books, newspapers and magazines, radio, and television. Thanks, Chuck, for an interesting morning with good humor!

### 3/2/20 – Vince Van Zago, Robotic Surgery

Vince, our club member, gave a presentation on history, applications, and examples of robotic surgery. He explained that the first documented use of a robot-assisted surgical procedure occurred in 1985 when the PUMA 560 robotic surgical arm was used in a delicate neurosurgical biopsy, a non-laparoscopic surgery. Some robotic surgery applications are gynecologic surgery, heart surgery, joint surgery coronary artery bypass, gallbladder removal, and kidney transplant. Vince informed us the robotic surgery is a minimally invasive surgery that uses robotic



arm manipulations to perform surgical procedures with more flexibility and precision than can be achieved by hand operations. Robotic devices, which have greater dexterity and range of motion than a human, allow a surgeon to successfully perform delicate surgeries in hard-to-reach places. Today, 1500 hospitals in the US use robotic surgery. A typical general-purpose robot costs about \$2M and requires \$110k-\$170k of maintenance annually. We hope that we don't have to use this technology. Thanks, Vince, for an informative presentation!
