March 15 – Rudi Baumann, "Blue Danube Trip Photos"


Rudi showed to club members photos of a riverboat cruise taken with wife Sharon from Prague to Budapest on the "Blue Danube". They saw many churches and palaces along the way, including an opera house where a different opera was performed every day. Countries visited were the Czech Republic, Hungary, Slovakia, and Austria. March 22 – Dr. Richard Cross and Eye Health Institute non-profit Treasurer Carl Gentzel, "Vision-Screening of Jamaica School Kids"

Dr. Richard Cross talked to club members about the volunteer eye-care project he started in 1996 that helps provide vision care to children and adults of all ages in the western areas of Jamaica. Every November for two weeks, Dr. Cross and up to 20 other eye doctors, opticians, and vision specialists from Colorado and other states pay their own way to Jamaica to provide children and adults with vision care. This includes giving basic eye exams and glaucoma tests, prescribing/fitting glasses, and (for eye surgeons in the group) doing cataract operations and other types of eye surgeries. Since 1996, Dr. Cross and his volunteers groups have provided vision help to over 5000 Jamaicans, delivering over 3000 pairs of glasses there. Last November, a 20-person volunteer group gave 186 eye exams, 267 vision screenings, and 134 pediatric exams; performed 16 eye surgeries; and saw a total of 598 patients. NOTE: If you have glasses not being used, you may donate them to Dr. Cross' Eye Health Institute (EHI) non-profit to match them up with people in Jamaican by calling EHI Treasurer Carl Gentzel at – 303-440-5541. March 27 Rocky Mountain District Key Club Convention

From March 26-28, the annual Rocky Mountain District's Key Club Convention was held at the Sheraton Denver West in Lakewood, attended by over 190 Key Club members from many of the RMD's 90 Key Clubs in Colorado, Wyoming, and Nebraska. Kerry Hassler attended the 8-11 a.m. "Key Club Advisors Workshop" to get information about Key Club leadership and activities to forward to Waverly Person in expectation he'll be the Foothills Advisor for a new Key Club at Boulder High School we'll try to start again in September.

During the Saturday luncheon (attended by Foothills members Dave Rogers and Kerry Hassler), the focus of the program was recognition by RMD Key Club Board members of fundraising done by many of the district's Key Clubs for Children of Peace International (COPI), a Kiwanis project started in 1998 by Binh Rybacki of the Ft. Collins Kiwanis Club. The initial COPI goal was build a school in Vietnam that would allow children to attend without needing to cross a dangerous river by ferry boat in which several kids of the existing school had drowned. Today, COPI supports 11 schools and orphanages in Vietnam which serve over 4500 children. The current total of COPI funds raised by RMD Key Clubs is over \$31,000 that's targeted for another school in Vietnam to be built, with a goal to raise \$32,000 more for the school within the next two years. A presentation was given by five current/former RMD Key Club leaders about a trip they made to Vietnam in 2009 to bring medicine and other needed items to orphanages and schools supported by COPI. A member of this group was Phuc Tran, former president of the Peak to Peak Charter School Key Club and Division 11/16 Key Club Lieutenant Governor, to whom our club made a 2009 donation to help her go on this trip. It was inspiring to see how Key Clubs in our district are following the Kiwanis motto of "Serving the Children of the World".
