## Snippets from Recent Club Programs

### November 21 – George Lopez, Boulder Salvation Army Bell-Ringing

George Lopez has been with the Salvation Army for 11 years, which included two years of pastoral training in southern California. He was reassigned in September from a Salvation Army assignment in Denver to become the manager of a new Salvation Army office in Boulder, located in the Nazarene Church at 300 S. Broadway. Part of his current duties is to be our club’s contact for bell-ringing at the 30<sup>th</sup> Street Sunrise King Soopers and the Meadows Shopping Center Safeway, working with our club’s bell-ringing coordinator Kerry Hassler to manage these two sites. George also manages four other bell-ringing sites in Lafayette and Longmont. He is looking for volunteer drivers and kettle-donation counters, so if you’re interested, contact him by email at -- [george.lopez.jr@usw.salvationarmy.org](mailto:george.lopez.jr@usw.salvationarmy.org).



During the current holiday season, George is distributing \$100 Salvation Army food coupons to needy families and individuals who live in the Boulder area, so far reaching a total of nearly 8 \$5000 of coupon given out. He is also managing a Salvation Army “angel tree” at the Macy’s store in the 28<sup>th</sup> Street Shopping Center. Next year, he’ll hire staff members in the new Boulder Salvation Army office, and will start new Salvation Army services and programs to assist those who are in need in our community. Next year, the Boulder Salvation Army office will organize and oversee bell-ringing and Salvation Army programs in Louisville in addition Boulder, Lafayette, and Longmont.

### November 28 – Rudi Baumann, Travelogue from Venice to Istanbul

Rudi showed photos of his and wife Sharon’s cruise in September that started in Venice and ended in Istanbul. This included photos in Venice of the Central Plaza, Doge’s Palace, Bridge of Sighs, canal boats, and the Bell Tower. The next photos were of Dubrovnik along the Dalmatian Coast in Croatia. Next were photos of Mykonos in Greece with its picturesque windmills and quaint villages. In Turkey, Rudi and Sharon visited Izmir (third largest city along the Aegean Sea), Istanbul, the Gallipoli WWI battle site and memorial, Ephesus, and other interesting places. Istanbul sights included the central marketplace, Cirigan Palace, Topaki Palace, and the Blue Mosque. ## **News from Ryan Mohling (Director, Developing Global Leaders) – Excerpt from his "Young Life" article**

"A story of sacrifice resonates 10 years later with a young leader 5,000 miles away." -- Mansur grew up as an orphan in a poor, closed Muslim country in Central Asia known for its persecution of Christians. Eventually taken in and raised by his grandparents, he started going to Young Life, where he began a relationship with Jesus. Disowned by his grandparents for his new faith, Mansur moved by himself to Russia to look for better work. He moved from city to city, often suffering mistreatment as a poor immigrant.

In every city he visited across Russia, Mansur looked for Young Life. He eventually landed south of Moscow in the city of Lipetsk, where there is, in fact, Young Life. Mansur quickly began volunteering with Capernaum (working with kids with special needs) and also served with a local homeless ministry. Two years ago, he was nominated and selected for Young Life's Developing Global Leaders (DGL) college scholarship and leadership development program.
