Snippets from Recent Club Programs

1/12/26 – Bill D, Red Kettle Results and Kiwanis International Fun

Bill provided a presentation on the 2025 Red Kettle results for the period 11/24/25 to 12/24/25. He reported participation by: 16 Kiwanians, 2) 15+ Key Club and Builders Club members, and 11 Saturday shifts by YoungLife students. We raised a total of \$18,595 bell ringing plus \$8,845 at our kickoff event for a total of \$27,440. The Salvation Army total for the area Red Kettle effort was \$105,036. There were only five open shifts for the period. Goals for next year are: 1) continue with a kickoff event, 2) recruit more attendees for the kickoff at a new location, 3) obtain more clubs and volunteers, and 4) add locations of KingSoopers and Walmart. At the conclusion of the meeting, President Chris added some KI videos for us. Thanks, Bill, for leading the successful Red Kettle effort in 2025 to help many in our community!



1/19/26 – Stan Hickory, Director of Innovation & Entrepreneurship at CU

Stan has more than two decades as a teacher, school leader, entrepreneur, and nonprofit founder who works with middle and high school and college students. He believes entrepreneurship should be accessible to everyone. He accomplishes the CU program in three phases: Connect, Catalyze, and Launch. The Connect phase includes mentoring, listening to idea builders, and mentor matching. The Catalyze phase provides the sustainability challenge, identifying leaders, and mentorship. The Launch phase brings students together on work projects. On April 22 this year, 175 students across campus will compete for \$325k of funding for their projects. He continues to champion the belief that entrepreneurship is not just a business discipline – it's a way of solving problems, creating opportunities, and shaping communities!
