<u>4/14/25 – Youth support for pregnant women</u> <u>in crisis</u>

May 5, 2025

Victoria, introduced by our own Pam B, is regional director of a 3 state region (CO, WY, NM) working to help youth and students who are pro-life to get involved. Includes support to pregnancy support centers, and promoting participation in March for Life events. 5 main areas. 1.Effective Education, with a different focus each semester. This year it's "think before you drink" and that mifepristone is now detectable in drinking water (!!) 2. Supportive Services, like MyChoice, working to make access easier, including share the word and community education. 3. Public Policy, working with legislators. 4. Street & Sidewalk encounters at clinics, including support and resources for postabortion psychological help, even addressing suicide. 5. Rapid Response-following proabortion groups & events; showing up to demonstrate that there are other pts of views, also social media.

Pam later talked about MyChoice's new fatherhood program, which engages the woman's

partner in the waiting room, and then inviting them into the woman's conference. An alarming insight: some quick in-and-out abortions are the result of human sex trafficking. Yikes!

<u>4/21/25 – Joseph Jupille, The Landscape of</u> <u>College Athletics</u>

Jospeh, a professor of Political Science, serves as the Faculty/Athletic representative at CU-Boulder, an independent position required by the NCAA. This consumes \sim 50% of his time for the school. NCAA has been going through "a tremendous transition" over the past 8 years, with more to come. Biggest so far has been the NIL: a player owns their own Name, Image and Likeness, they can make money off from NIL, even as amateur collegiate athletes.

Also, the transfer portal has made transfers wide open and easy, and very beneficial to the bigger more successful programs. A House settlement will lead
