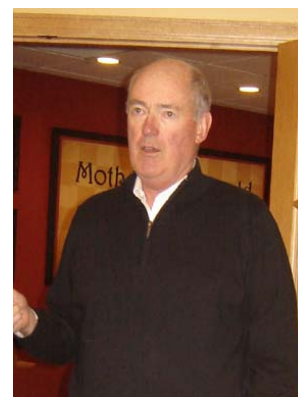

Snippets from Recent Club Programs

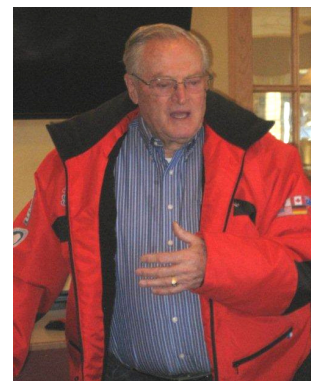
April 18 – Paul Jerde, Entrepreneurship in Colorado


Paul Jerde spoke to our club about entrepreneurship in Colorado, more specifically in Boulder. He said some claim that Boulder is the #1 entrepreneurial city in the US. There are claims in the press that Boulder is in the list of the “best 25 cities to start businesses.” Paul claims that the top cities have good characteristics of: ideas, risk-takers, culture, resources, and research. He gave a nice history and timeline of Boulder, and told how Boulder changed with the addition of IMB and NBS. Many of our current companies have a link back to one of these organizations. Paul has a long background in business in Boulder. He most recently served as the Executive Director of the Deming Center for Entrepreneurship in the Leeds School of Business at the University of Colorado. He served in that role from 2004-13 and had been a member of the Deming Center Advisory Board since 1996. Thanks, Paul, for an interesting program.



April 25 – Rudi Baumann, Adventures in Antarctica

Rudi presented a very interesting program on his January trip to Antarctica with Tauck Tours. He and his wife first flew into Buenos Aires, Argentina, for sightseeing and preparation for their trip to Tierra Del Fuego and Ushuala. That is where they boarded their ship for a two-hour voyage with 106 in their group to the Antarctic Peninsula. Once there, they enjoyed naturalist hosted outings and viewed several varieties of penguins, humpback whales, and icebergs. They travelled by kodiak rafts from the ship to the locations they toured. Once on land, boots and poles needed to be disinfected to avoid contaminating the environment. Rudi noted that the trip was quite strenuous with numerous hikes. Another interesting point was that in January it was warmer in Antarctica than in Boulder. It is their summer in January. Rudi was surprised at the number of ships on the peninsula. As with other destinations, there are more tourists these days. Another interesting point brought up in discussion by Adam was that Antarctica holds 90% of the world’s ice and 70% of the world’s fresh water. Rudi, thanks for sharing this travel adventure!

KIWANIS: Serving the Children of the World

May 2 – Michael J. Gough- CU Naval ROTC

Colonel Gough, a 27 year veteran of the US Marine Corp, told us of his experience flying Harrier aircraft off the carrier, USS Essex. He has been deployed nine times in just 7 ½ years; he was assigned to train Spanish pilots in the Harrier. He described the new replacement aircraft for the Marine Corps – the F-35B stealth aircraft which is being delivered by Lockheed Martin. He described the space age helmet worn by the pilots to observe the sky around the aircraft. He is currently the head of Naval ROTC at the University of Colorado. There are 125 ROTC students; about 1/3 are Marines and the remaining 2/3 are Navy students. He indicated that about 20% of all ROTC students are female. We appreciate your service to our country!
