11/14/22 – Lauren Nygren & Nick Peterson, Reverse Mortgages

Lauren is a Senior Loan Officer with Cherry Creek Mortgage. She studied real estate and finance at Villanova University and worked for a real estate private equity firm in Philadelphia prior to making her return to CO. Nick is the branch manager for both the Ft. Collins and Boulder offices. He has spent his career in banking and has been spearheading the company's efforts in originating reverse mortgages. We learned that 53% of households are at risk of not having enough to maintain their living standards during retirement. Federally funded reverse mortgages are backed by the Federal Housing Administration (FHA). Eligibility requirements are: be 62 years old or older, live in the property as primary residence, and be able to pay taxes, insurance, and property maintenance charges. No repayments are required toward principal, interest, or mortgage insurance if at least one borrower still lives in the home as his or her primary residence.
