

Snippets from Recent Club Programs

Jan 31, 2011

January 17 -- Captain Laura Fenton, Salvation Army Bell-Ringing

Captain Laura talked to our club about the results of this past holiday season's Salvation Army bell-ringing in Boulder County, during which \$110,000 was collected by volunteer and paid bell-ringers. She thanked Foothills Kiwanis and all of our bell-ringing volunteers to collect almost \$20,000, where our club was again awarded (for the 10th year in a row) the Salvation Army's trophy for collecting the most donations by any Boulder County community-service organization. Captain Laura also talked about this



year's Boulder County Salvation Army programs and services that bellringing donations will be used for, including rental and utility support for lowincome families, after-school tutoring for students in Broomfield, and providing emergency housing to the needy. Club members shared experiences while doing bell-ringing of donations received from needy people and those who learned of the low overhead of Salvation Army programs.

January 24 -- Michael Duran, Artistic Director - Boulder Dinner Theater

Michael J. Duran, a longtime actor from Boulder who appeared in such Broadway productions as "Hello, Dolly" with Carol Channing and TV shows, spoke about the Boulder Dinner Theater where he's the artistic director and occasionally an actor in stage productions. His responsibilities include actor selection, script and dancing details, sound and lighting, and stage management. Mr. Duran noted that the Boulder Theater offers "Kids Kabaret" performances designed for children in preschool through grade five, as well as a Summer Drama Camp and classes for students entering



grades 6 through 12. Since 1977, the Boulder Dinner Theater has been providing live, Broadway-quality entertainment by company members who've performed on stages all over the country. The theater's next production will be "Swing!" running from March 4 through May 8.

Foothills Kiwanis Receives Annual Bell-Ringing Award

During the January 17 club meeting, Foothills Kiwanis received the Boulder County Salvation Army's annual bell-ringing award for the 10th year in a row. Shown below with the award is leading Foothills bell-ringer Kerry Hassler (24 hours), along with next highest bell-ringers Bob Mohling (21 hours) and Greg Lefferdink (20 hours). In all, a total of 318 hours were donated by volunteers who did bell-ringing between November 26-Deccember 24.



Also recognized during the meeting were members of the Golden Nuggets Kiwanis Club who range a total of 30 hours, led by Arlene Devore (shown below with Kerry) with 13.5 hours of bell-ringing. Other leading non-club volunteers not able to attend were Lynn Dyba (14 hours), Dick Bradfield (12 hours), and Hope and Bert Nett (12 hours). Many thanks to these volunteers!



With the past season's total of \$19, 598.60, the bell-ringing donations collected by Foothills Kiwanis volunteers since 1996 total **\$334,921.69**, an average of \$23,922 per year. The total bell-ringing time donated by all volunteers during this span is **4525** hours, equivalent to 566 8-hour work-days.
