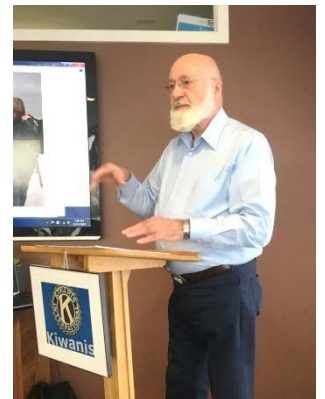

## Snippets from Recent Club Programs

### 11/11/19 – Tracy Perry, Veterans Day Celebration

Air Force veteran, Tracy Perry, shared the story of his uncle, Paul Perry, a Navy sailor, his ship the USS Canopus, his capture in the Philippines at the start of World War II, and ultimate death in a Japanese POW camp near Osaka, Japan. The USS Canopus was a submarine tender in the US Navy, named for the star Canopus. On December 29, 1941 she received her first direct bomb hit. On January 1, 1942 she received a second direct bomb hit. Of the Canopus crew, 221 were evacuated to Corregidor where they served with the US Marines on beach defenses. The final 327 crewmen were also evacuated to Corregidor and fought during the final battle for the island fortress. Nearly all Canopus crewmen were captured at the fall of Corregidor and spent the rest of the war in Japanese POW camps in the Philippines and the Asian mainland. A total of 212 crewmen were declared killed or missing in action. We thank all the US members of WWII armed forces for defending our liberties!



### 11/18/19 – Major Mike Paugh, The Salvation Army Red Kettle

Major Mike Paugh was born and raised in in Huntington Beach CA. He lived there until he went to the Salvation Army's College for Officers Training in 1997. Once commissioned he and his wife, Major Beth, were sent to Anacortes Washington where they served as pastors for 6 years. They served at the following locations: Crestmont College in Rancho Palos Verdes, CA; Stanislaus County: Torrance, CA; the Salvation Army's Adult Rehabilitation Center in Anaheim and Santa Monica, CA; Mesa, AZ; Las Vegas, Nevada, and now Broomfield, CO. Major Mike earned his Bachelor's Degree in Advanced Theological Studies at Booth University in Winnipeg Manitoba Canada. He earned his Master's Degree in Organizational leadership at Abilene Christian University in Abilene, Texas. He gave the history of The Salvation Army with its start by William Booth in London; TSA is now located in 129 countries around the world. The Red Kettle was started in 1891 in Liverpool to help feed the hungry. TSA was key to starting the USO. Thanks for all you do for Broomfield!
