

7/31/2023 - James "Mac" McCarty. Mac gave us an

astonishing, surprising, and rather gloomy summary of his extensive research on the terrorist attacks on US facilities in Benghazi, Libya. This is all extensively covered in



his recent publication "The Benghzi Betrayal" (available on Amazon both used and new). Starting with the Arab Spring and the removal of Ghadafi (2011) he describes Middle East history until the attacks on Sept 11, 2012. The day of the attacks is described in detail, nearly minute by minute: what was going on in Benghazi, Tripoli, US bases around the Mediterranean, and most interestingly, in the White House (which was largely nothing in regard to action and decision). The administration's errors, misjudgment and "paralysis by analysis" – from toppling Qadhafi, to lack of any planning as to what should happen after, and throughout the day Sept 11, 2012 are astonishing. We had plenty of notice via violent hostility toward the US at the Benghazi mission compound for months – warning shots that weren't heeded; in fact, the US State Dep't drew down security forces in response. MacCarty has details on all these, and more; he's not afraid to name names. His major sources were the (very lengthy) House Select Committee on Benghazi Report and a book by Mitchell Zuckoff, "13 hours: The inside account of What Really Happened in Benghazi." His presentation and book reveal terrible (and fatal) consequences of the administration's poor and slow decision making, lack of appropriate planning and action. The main upshot of that was 4 Americans died, including Ambassador Stephens. In short, a substantial government effort (less than 2 months before a presidential election) to withhold and cover up information regarding the Administration's failures. Several club members have read, or are reading, McCarty's book. All strongly recommend reading.
