## Snippets from Recent Club Programs

### September 25 – Craig Hurst, Fathers in the Field

Craig, a member of our club, spoke to us about a program to mentor fatherless boys. He described the journey between him and the young boy he is mentoring, Robbie. Craig described the state of our boys: more locked up boys and young men in US than any other country; annually, 3 million boys are put on behavior drugs; boys make up 71% of all school suspensions; majority of boys are homeless, physically abused, neglected, awaiting adoption, alcoholics & drug addicts; and over 50% of boys in US live in fatherless homes. His church is bringing together mentor Christian men and fatherless boys from ages 7-17. Program



mission is to rekindle and establish the spirit of the boys by healing the deep anger and possibly stop the cycle of destruction. Thanks, Craig, for any interesting and worthy program. For more info, go to: <https://www.fathersinthefield.com>.

### October 9 – Joe Horther, Colorado Refugee Services Program

Joe, who is the Colorado Refugee Integration Coordinator, was born and raised in Durango, Colorado. He has studied and worked in Spain, Mexico, Paraguay, Morocco, El Salvador, Dominican Republic, St. Lucia, China and Mongolia. He has an extensive background in nonprofit management, program management and training in diverse cultural settings. Joe has enjoyed working with government officials, business people and grass roots community organizers from all over the world. Joe received a M.Ed. in International Education from the University of Massachusetts at Amherst. Some of the interesting facts he presented are: there are more displaced people in the world than any time in modern history; according to 2016 UNHCR stats, there are 65.6 million forcibly displaced persons in the world (if this were a nation, it would be the 24th largest); and the average wait time for a refugee in an UNCHR camp is 17 years. His goal is to help the refugee population integrate with the greater community around them. Refugees, who work hard at integration and have integration opportunities afforded to them by the people in their communities, usually contribute more to the well-being of the United States than those who don't.

## October 5 Foothills Kiwanis Board Minutes

The Board of the Foothills Kiwanis Club met in the Memorial Room (Atrium Area Basement near Roots Café), Avista Hospital 100 Health Park Drive, Louisville, CO, on October 4, 2017.

President Paul called the meeting to order at 7:14 am. Attending were Board members: President Bailey, Treasurer Girard, Secretary Czanderna, Mohling, Fusilier, Hurst, Hinson, Boeve, and Gilland.

Guests: Janet and Bruce Gilland.

President Paul stated that in the future he will be sending out the agenda a week in advance of the meeting. He also proposed that Mr. Fred Fusilier be approved to be on the Board. The Board unanimously accepted and approved this proposal. Fusilier was added as a member of the Board.

The September 7 Board Meeting Minutes were approved after Mohling suggested that Peters be changed to Rogers in the list of attendees. Bob moved to accept the minutes and Alan seconded and all said aye.

Treasurer’s report: Jerry gave the administrative account saying that all dues are paid except for one member. When one member is on LOA, they pay dues only to international and not for meals.

Jerry had the bills to be handed out. He said honorary members cost a certain amount. He takes off meal cost for LOA members, but charges them the Kiwanis international fees. Everyone needs to pay dues. Beginning in January 2018, everyone will pay regular dues minus meal costs if they miss a club meeting.

The discrepancy on the financial report was due to round off in the summary report.

All general assets are in checking account.

The budget was accepted because the numbers are correct. The projected budget based on past actuals. Joe moved to accept the budget, Bob seconded and all said aye.

### Logistics:

Craig Hurst presented a criteria flyer and a list of possible locations. He recommended that we score locations according to a prescribed set of criteria. Alan, Steve and Craig will visit locations and make a recommendation at next meeting. Pres. Paul recommended that we have the next meeting at the top choice location. Bob emphasized the need for our new location to be close to places of work for those employed, and to be mindful of our commitment to get Waverly to the meetings.

The current dues level of \$160 will stay the same unless the cost of meals at new location changes.

Assignments related to song / invocation / other – Paul asked for someone to volunteer.

Inventory – Secretary Mark stated that we need 25 year pins. Craig recommended Kiwanis business cards for members. Paul suggested name cards with blanks to fill-in. Steve said Kiwanis website has template, Paul will make 500 cards up. Steve is editing the Kiwanis website.

Jerry is doing service dog website and would like to hand the responsibility over to someone.

Fred suggested we put the Kiwanis newsletter on screen. Bob moved that we put newsletter on email and only print enough bulletins for the speaker and guests. Steve seconded and all

said aye. Bob recommended that we send the program to the honorary members.

Website – use full name for members on the website and for Circle K, but not for key club members because of privacy laws.

Fred Fusilier scheduled to be officially inducted into the Foothills Kiwanis on Monday, 10/9.

We need a member that is a lead person on recruitment.

### **October 5 Foothills Foundation Board Minutes – Foothills Kiwanis Secretary, Capt. Mark Czanderna**

The Board of the Foundation of the Foothills Kiwanis Club met in the Memorial Room (Atrium Area Basement near Roots Café), Avista Hospital 100 Health Park Drive, Louisville, CO, on October 4, 2017.

President Paul called the meeting to order at 7:48 am. Attending were Board members: President Bailey, Treasurer Girard, Secretary Czanderna, Mohling, Fusilier, Hurst, Hinson, Boeve, and Gilland.

Guests: Janet and Bruce Gilland.

The September 7 Foundation Minutes were approved after Mohling suggested that Peters be changed to Rogers in the list of attendees. Bob moved to accept the minutes and Alan seconded and all said aye.

Treasurer's report: Jerry distributed handouts with all the budget updates on them. He noted that there was a glitch in the system that caused one error on the report, but he corrected it. He said that there is a \$3 charge if someone examines a check deposit online. Mitrani Foundation deposited \$250 into the account. The budget is balanced. The service dog income is nearly duplicate the club's income. There is no outstanding transaction. The Board thanked Jerry for his report in the installation brochure. Jerry added that he was thankful that 10,000 came to the ALS walk.

Secretary's report: Captain Mark reported that bell ringing season begins on November 13 and ends on December 23. Paul stated that November dates will be good for CKI members. Paul stated that the 2016 goal for bell ringing was \$14,000. The goal for 2017 is \$15,000. Captain Mark reported that this year, members can sign up for bell ringing via an online site: registertoring.com. Mark can also track kettle incomes on daily basis with Salvation Army computer software.

#### **2018 Projects:**

January 1 - Golf project has to be initiated.

President Paul proposed shift to virtual competition because auditions, specific times and dates are difficult for some parents and children. A cost of \$50 per child is required to acquire space for a venue. Pres. Paul recommended a video competition where judges review videos. The club will still

pay judges. Winners will receive a \$100 stipend. Judges will get a higher stipend. Judges can do work on their own time. Bob recommended that we have winners perform for our club. This way, members get to meet the parents. Mark offered The Salvation Army facility in Broomfield for the venue because it has a stage and can be set up for meals as well.

Pres. Paul suggested that Taste of Boulder be limited to certain kinds of food like ice cream. Taste of Pearl competes with this event. Paul stated that the restaurants are already busy during the summer on Saturdays. Owners would prefer us to do this event during the off season.

Youth Programs – Pres. Paul stated that background checks for youth protection training are necessary to be involved with CKI. The cost of the background check is \$5, but Kiwanis is charging \$25.

The Monarch Key Club meets at 7 am on Tuesdays – Steve Hinson will attend. Dave Rogers and Rudi Baumann are backups.

Peak to Peak Key Club meets at 12:30 pm on Mondays, Rachel Medina is the in-house leader. Dave and Bob represent our club.

University of Colorado CKI. Pres. Bailey is our representative. Paul stated that the previous president K Foster is not available this semester. No meetings this semester yet. November 1 is a possible start date. There was nothing more to report at this time.

Pres. Paul stated that the Junior World Quizzing Championships on September 16 needs check for \$200 to International Quizzing Association.

Pres. Paul spoke of funds and adjustment of awards for Solar Rollers. Solar Rollers need a check for \$1250. A \$1,000 scholarship was returned. President Paul recommended that we give the money to Boulder Valley School District. Boulder Solar Rollers are educating people about converting power sources to solar energy. Boulder High is the school that could do this. Paul proposes we reallocate what we decided already to do. Bob moved that we accept this proposal and Joe seconded it, all said aye.
