February 20 – Doug Yeiser, Foothills United Way

Doug Yeiser, UW President & CEO, gave an informative program on the Foothills United Way. Doug has been with UW for over 30 years at many different locations – the last four in Boulder Valley. He explained that UW started 127 years ago in Denver; there are now 900 UW agencies in the US. The vision of Foothills UW is - A community working together in which all people can achieve their full potential. Doug explained that UW has recognized the agency is spread too thin and therefore a collaborative effort is needed to meet the needs of many of the 300,000 people living in Boulder Valley. He noted that there are over 700 nonprofit volunteer agencies and over 800 governmental agencies that are collaborating to avoid duplication of effort and to search for gaps. Over \$5.3M has been provided to 1200 homeowners from Jamestown, Lyons, and Longmont whose property was destroyed in the 2013 flood.
