Snippets from Recent Club Programs

February 4 – Colonel Michael Gough, Commanding Officer, Naval ROTC at CU


Michael Gough, Colonel, USMC, is Professor and Commanding Officer of Naval Sciences at the University of Colorado. He spoke to us about his past military assignments as an AV-8B Harrier pilot in Iraq and Commander of a F-35B squadron that has just been deployed to an aircraft carrier. He shared that the F-35B helmet alone costs \$450k, and then responded to several life stories: What Goes Up, Pay Attention to Me, and Pickle or No Pickle. He is a graduate of James Madison University and has served in several Marine Attack Squadrons, holding various leadership positions: Aviation Safety Officer, Aircraft Maintenance Officer, Operations Officer, Detachment Officer-in-Charge, Executive Officer, and Commanding Officer. He has deployed numerous times to combat operations and as part of periodic unit deployments. Thank you, Col. Gough, for your service to our country!



February 11 – Stephen Presser, Northwestern Law Professor of Legal History Emeritus, CU Visiting Scholar in Conservative Thought & Policy

Stephen Presser is the 2018-19 Visiting Scholar in Conservative Thought and Policy in the College of Arts and Sciences at the University of Colorado. He is a leading American legal historian and expert on shareholder liability for corporate debts. He is frequently an invited witness before committees of the US Senate and House of Representatives. He holds a joint appointment with the J.L. Kellogg Graduate School of Management and also teaches in Northwestern's history department. He spoke to us about the two traditions in American Jurisprudence: originalism and living document. He cited several books/articles worth reading: Michael Walsh, Time Magazine, "The Devil's Pleasure Place"; Stephen Presser, Recapturing the Constitution; and Cass Sunstein, The Conservative Mind.
