Snippets from Recent Club Programs

July 16 – Francea Phillips, Meals on Wheels

Francea Phillips, President & CEO, and Heidi Marchi, Director of Marketing & Communications, spoke to us about Meals on Wheels in Boulder. For nearly 50 years, Meals on Wheels of Boulder has provided nutritious meals to residents who need and want meals, regardless of age or income. They explained that each weekday, 250 meals are delivered to our neighbors in Boulder. Frozen meals are available for weekends, too. Meals are tailored according to clients' medical needs and dietary preferences. They have been asked to leave the West Boulder Senior Center after 26 years. They will break ground on new facility in fall of 2018 and plan to move in by the end of 2019. Their building will be part of the McKenzie Junction development in NE Boulder. July 23 – Michele Geissler, Classical Conversations

Founders of the United States, including Thomas Jefferson, were educated in the Classical style with background in Latin, history, philosophy, literature, science, and architecture. When their children were school age, Michele and her husband observed that public schools were focused on providing “an outcome based education”. The children did well on tests, but from year-to-year had a low retention rate. From the parents' perspective, the children had too much homework, which left little time for family activities and family discussions. And, the public school curriculum lacked a “God basis”; thus, the parents were concerned that their children's hearts were lost. Home Schooling with the Classical Conversations curriculum provided a Biblical world view and the flexibility that public education lacked. The curriculum is structured to meet the child's stages of development. Early childhood (elementary) education (ages 4-12) focuses on “Grammar”, developing skills in memorizing and reciting. Middle school education focuses on “Dialectic” (logic), developing skills in thinking and questioning. KIWANIS: Serving the Children of the World

July 30 – Jennifer Hinderliter, WOW Museum

Jennifer Hinderliter is the Executive Director of the WOW (World of Wonder) Children's Museum in Lafayette. The museum is located at 110 N Harrison Ave, which is south of Baseline Road and east of South Public Road. The space is provided by the City of Lafayette. The museum hosts approximately 90,000 visitors annually. It has 5 full-time and 9 part-time staff members, plus 170 volunteers. The Museum's annual operating budget is approximately \$700,000, which is primarily funded by 2,000 community memberships, daily admission fees, and donations from the community. The Museum offers fun, educational and hands-on exhibits and programs for children ages 1-11 years old. The Museum hosts a variety of art, science, dramatic play, and practical life exhibits for children. Many of these exhibits are created in-house by staff members, volunteers, and collaborators. The Museum is also an excellent resource for memorable field trips and outside-the-classroom learning for school and community groups. The Museum Board, along with staff, has worked together to define philosophy moving forward, to describe plans for renovation of existing facilities, and to quantify needs for future museum space. The vision for the future includes 20,000 square feet of useable space, on a donated site, with a construction budget of \$7 million, but financing of this vision is yet to be determined. In the meantime, the Museum has continuing needs for individuals and groups to volunteer time and expertise to keep the facilities in operation.
