Snippets from Recent Club Programs

August 23 - Dennis Lewis, Director of "Dental Aid" Non-Profit


Dr. Dennis Lewis gave a talk about the "Dental Aid" non-profit that provides free dental care for poor families and individuals in Boulder and surrounding communities through dentists who donate their services. Although some of their patients are as young as two years, typically dental care is provided to older kids up to age 12 who've not experienced anything but pain in their teeth since infancy. By improving the dental health of pregnant mothers, Dental Aid dentists have seen dental problems in newborns decrease substantially. Funding for Dental Aid non-profit programs is provided through mostly government grants and private donations. August 30 - Judge Russell Carparelli, "Lincoln's Legacy of Equality and Liberty"

Judge Russell Carparelli talked to club members about the impact Abraham Lincoln had in causing enhancements to our Constitution that made it more consistent with the basic human-rights equality principles stated in our Declaration of Independence from England. With the passage of the 13th Amendment in 1865 that abolished all slavery in America, individual states were no longer able to allow slavery within their borders. Also due to Lincoln's legacy after his death, the passage of the 14th Amendment in 1868 enforced Federal guidelines of equal equality to apply to people of all races in all states. Judge Carparelli also talked about the human side of Lincoln, whose tall stature and stark face was the target of slanderous jokes by especially political opponents. He even made jokes about his face in saying – "If I were two-faced, would I be wearing this one?" We are all indebted to Lincoln for greater freedom and liberties enjoyed by all people in America today.

Foothills Kiwanis September 2 Board Meeting Minutes

The Kiwanis Club of the Foothills Board of Directors met at Parkway Restaurant on September 2, 2010. President Hassler called the meeting to order at 7:00 a.m. Attending:

SECRETARY'S REPORT: August Foothills Board minutes were presented on behalf of Secretary Hubbard (absent), and were approved without changes after motion by Sprenkle (seconded by Person).

TREASURER'S REPORT: Treasurer Girard presented the Foothills financial Payouts from the Project Account were made to the the University of Colorado for 2009-2010 Tuition Scholarship (\$1000), Crayons to Calculators project (\$500), and to RMD "Lucky Seven" Fund for Key Club Support (\$84). The budgeted deficit in Project Account income versus payouts for the 2009-2010 club year is estimated to end up at \$1600-\$1700. The Treasurer's Report was approved without changes after motion by Sprenkle (seconded by McGehan).

OLD BUSINESS:

- (Lefferdink) Decided to leave Foothills USPS box at downtown Boulder office where it is.
- (Gilland) Foothills Kiwanis list of authorized signatures at our bank was corrected to remove Jennifer Lock's name and update with current club officer names.

NEW BUSINESS:

- Regarding club membership, President Hassler received a letter of resignation from Sandy Felte due to her work and health concerns (accepted by Board vote). David Petrick is returning to Boulder from his work in Florida, and will resume being an active member in September.
- For the Foothills Induction Ceremony and Program for 2010-2011 officers and Board members, President Hassler will not be able to participate due to his being in Africa to do non-profit technical consulting activities. McGehan will conduct the induction ceremonies on his behalf along with Division 11 Lt. Governor Heidi Storz.
- Foothills President-Elect Girard reviewed a draft version of the 2010-2011 Foothills club budget with projected income/payouts for the club's Project Account. Joe will have a final version of this budget to present to Board members during the October 7 Board meeting.
- McGehan thanked President Hassler and Secretary Gilland for their 2009-2010 service on behalf of Board.

Board meeting adjourned by President Hassler at 8:04 a.m.

NOTE: For Key Clubs in the Kiwanis Rocky Mountain District, they have collectively raised over \$50,000 in funds in support of the "Children of Peace International" non-profit organization started by Loveland Kiwanis Binh Rybacki in 1993. COPI now supports 14 orphanages in Vietnam. RMD Key Clubs are doing additional fundraising the next two years to be able to build another elementary school in a poor area of Vietnam. We Foothills Kiwanians should all be proud of the Key Clubs in our District and in other locations around the world that enthusiastically help children with true Kiwanis spirit.
