Snippets from Recent Club Programs

3/4/19 - Alissa Trumbull, A Precious Child Update

Alissa has been with A Precious Child since November 2017, initially overseeing the organization's events prior to transitioning into Development & Marketing. Her background is in startup businesses and corporate marketing, however, her schooling is in Social Work, making her transition to helping disadvantaged and displaced children a natural one. A Precious Child is a nonprofit organization providing children and their families throughout the Denver Metro area with the basic essentials they need to thrive. Founded in 2008 in the garage of Carina Martin, A Precious Child is based on the idea of collaboration. A Precious Child currently works with 440 Agency Partners throughout the area, coming alongside these organizations to support them in their good missions and fill in gaps in service. 3/11/19 – Cynthia Brooks, History of US Flags

Cynthia currently works as a Principal at Mc Enterprises LLC in Boulder. Before moving to Boulder, Cynthia lived in Rochester NY, Mount Kisco NY, and Greenwich CT. She informed us of the history of our flag, and described the many flags that have been made. In June 1777, the Second Continental Congress passed the Flag Resolution which stipulated the flag of the thirteen United States be thirteen stripes, alternate red and white; that the union be thirteen stars, white in a blue field, representing a new constellation. The first official US flag flown during battle was on August 3, 1777, at Fort Schuyler (Fort Stanwix) during the Siege of Fort Stanwix. Massachusetts reinforcements brought news of the adoption by Congress of the official flag to Fort Schuyler. The flag was made from clothing materials of the soldiers and their families. She showed examples of the circular 13-star pattern of the Revolutionary War era, the pre-civil war flag with 32 stars, the 1912 48-star arrangement (set as standard by President Taft), and the 49 and 50 star arrangements. She described flag etiquette and how to properly destroy a flag. Thanks for an informative program on our American flags!
