## Snippets from Recent Club Programs

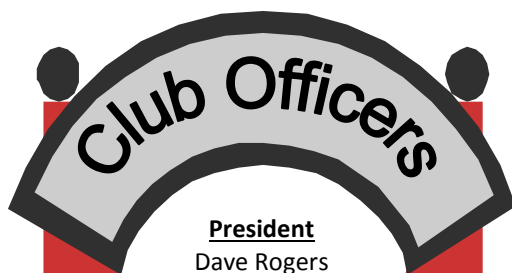
### 9/23/19 – Joe Girard, Going to Mars

Joe, a long-time member of our club, is originally from Wisconsin. He has engineering experience at Boeing, Beech, Ball, and Laboratory for Atmospheric & Space Physics (LASP). Joe described a mission to study dynamic changes in the atmosphere of Mars over days and seasons led by the United Arab Emirates (UAE); it involves LASP as the leading U.S. scientific-academic partner. Known as the Emirates Mars Mission (EMM), the project is being designed to observe weather phenomena like Martian clouds and dust storms as well as changes in temperature, water vapor, and other gases throughout the layers of the atmosphere. The launch window for the vehicle is July 14-August 3, 2020. The UAE has a credible 100-year plan to colonize Mars. Thanks, Joe, for an interesting presentation!



### 9/30/19 – 50th Annual Installation of Club Officers and Directors

The ceremony on September 30 started with greetings from Heather McChesney, Division Lt. Governor. 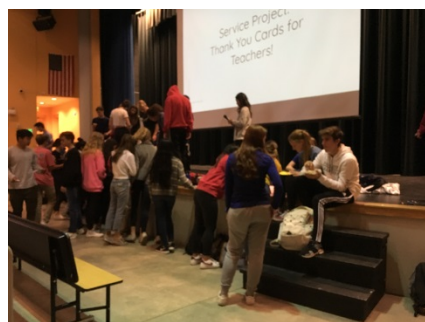
