## Snippets from Recent Club Programs

### 7/11/11 – 7/18/2011 → Dennis Hubbard, “Scenes from Semester at Sea” and his trip around the world.

Dennis Hubbard regaled us on consecutive weeks, sharing his experiences of his 4-month-long “semester at sea.” Week 1 was largely an overview, including a summary of the history of Semester at Sea. The trip involved many “field trips” (land based) and some side water trips, including a trip up the Amazon.

Dominica, in the Lesser Antilles, is a beautiful island retaining the influence of the French in its architecture – and possessing a Carnegie Library. Did you know that the Amazon drains a watershed the size of the United States? They fished for piranha in the Amazon. Cayman (wee-gators) populate the Amazon and its jungles. The city of Manaus, well up the river, is now a thriving manufacturing city, largely attributable to its status as a Free Economic Zone (Free Trade).

Ghana, on Africa’s gold coast, sports a dark history as a center of slave trade, 12-14 million taken from this region, the vast majority ending up in Brazil, the Caribbean and (unexpectedly) the east African coast. Approx 1/2 million ended up in British colonies that eventually became the US. Gold is still mined there, and it is a source of strife between the various tribes. A curious gov’t structure, wherein the leader is selected by a Queen Mother, who is elected directly to solve intertribal conflicts.

In South Africa, they were privileged to tour the local wine country just outside Cape Town, as well as several Habitat for Humanity sites.

Through the Indian Ocean they stopped by the island country of Mauritius as well as a surprise health-emergency-related stop at the US Naval base at Diego Garcia, which is leased from the British government.

In Hanoi the older folks on the tour insisted that the field trip stop by the “Hanoi Hilton” – sad to say that many of the students had no idea what it was, or that Cap’t John McCain was tortured there for six years. Evidence of the French culture – which largely departed after the colossal loss at Dien Bien Phu in 1954 – is still evident. Now, more than 35 years after the end of the US-VietNam war, it is becoming rather a tourist attraction.




- For the first club meeting of each month, bring either –
