Snippets from Recent Club Programs

July 22 – Valerie Solheim, "The Beehive Effect: Ancient Rites - Quantum Principles"

Valarie spoke to our club about the investigation she's done to improve the keeping bees and their hives healthy by creating "earth energy-rich zones" using metal rings of various sizes. Protecting bees is becoming increasingly important with the reported loss of between 10-20 percent of hives the last several years, resulting in lower production levels for corn, fruits, and other agricultural products. Some of this is due to overuse of pesticides to kill various insects, rather than to focus on the root cause of the problem (such as undernourished crops and trees. July 29 – Dr. Fungchatou Lo, Missionary to Cambodia

Shown in the photo between co-pastor Narit Phan and Kiwanis program host Bob Mohling, Dr. Lo, (a pastor and missionary based in Phnom Phen, Cambodia), spoke to our club about the many programs he and his church in Phnom Phen have organized to help needy Cambodians, including:

- Angel Dormitory – Provides Christian education and vocational training for up to 50 Cambodian students
- Helping Hands – Provides school supplies/uniforms to needy students
- Scholarship Fund – Helps orphans and needy students complete post-high school education for \$150-\$240 per year.
- Annual Youth Conference – Brings many young people together to build hope in this country haunted by the atrocities of the early 70's Communist dictator Pol Pot
- Community Health Education – Building public toilets and teaching basic sanitation practices such as washing hands before eating.

Dr. Lo also talked about the problems with corruption at all levels of Cambodian government, and the continued shortage of competent doctors, dentists, lawyers, and other professions murdered during the Poi Pot regime. However, the use of technology is rapidly increasing with widespread use of cellphones and the Internet.

Due to the low attendance, neither of the Board meetings was called to order. Following are a few notes of several items brought up during this gathering --

- John Shoaf requested a 3-week LOA, and Gary Symes has requested a 6-month LOA. Also, Kerry Hassler requested a 3-month LOA from September 9 to November 18 when he will be working on non-profit's projects in Thailand, Cambodia, Japan, and Kenya.
- As discussed during the July 3 Foothills Board meeting to especially improve tracking of our Spice of Life payments, Gilland will switch our club's General Account and Boulder Foundation funds from the CU Credit Union to Wells Fargo to show same-day updates for transactions.
- Allison DeYoung brought documents to transfer our club's Boulder Foundation investment account from Morgan Stanley to Higgins/DeYoung. These documents will be signed by Secretary Hubbard upon his return from vacation and submitted for final processing by Allison this month.
