

Snippets from Recent Club Programs

5/13/19 – Stephen Jones, How to be a Horror Professor

Stephen Graham Jones is the author of sixteen and a half novels, six story collections, a couple of novellas, and a couple of one-shot comic books. Most recent are: Mapping the Interior and My Hero. Next are: The Only Good Indians and Night of the Mannequins. Stephen grew up the son of a farmer near Midland, TX. He attended Texas Tech and planned to do tractor custom farming after he received his degree. He started writing at 19; he wrote a story while a teaching assistant with pencil and spiral notebook in three days while attending to his uncle during ICU recovery. He received an English Department



recognition and cash award for the story. A back injury forced him to think about a desk job. He completed his PhD from Florida State in two years. In 2008 CU called and offered him a job in their English Department. He mentioned that he is the first tribal member of his family to obtain a degree. He now lives and teaches in Boulder, Colorado.

5/20/19 – Hannah Jamsay, Uplift International

Our speaker on May 20th was Hanna Jamsay, Executive Director of Uplift Internationale. UI provides life changing cleft surgeries to impoverished children in the Philippine Islands. Making a mission trip annually, the organization performs up to 100 surgeries at no charge to the children's families. Originally from Westminster and trained as a nurse, Hanna has been with UI 11 years—the first eight as a volunteer. The



organization, whose motto is "mending faces-one child at a time", was started in 1989 by Dr. James Yrastorza. In the past 30 years, over 1800 cleft surgeries have been performed.

In the rural areas of the Philippines (7,100 islands total), 1 in 4 children are born with clefts, compared with 1 in 400 in Manila and 1 in 800 in the United States. Children born with clefts in the lip, pallet, or roof of the mouth, face many devastating issues such as keeping food in their mouths, major dental issues, respiratory issues, jaw deformation, and constant shunning and ridicule by schoolmates. \$250 in donations will pay for one surgery. Recovery takes about six months, and families of the surgical patients are housed and fed by UI. The hospital and quarters house about 117 people. UI trains each family in CPR for home care and have recently expanded their services to checking vision and issuing glasses. Go to the UI website for donation information.
