## Snippets from Recent Club Programs

### May 20 – Ann Kelly, CU Women’s Golf Coach

Coach Kelly spoke to club members about her University of Colorado Women’s Golf Team that was ranked No. 11 in NCAA Women’s Golf Division 1 at the end of last season. After losing three senior golfers from that team, this year’s team is not doing as well, finishing in 8th place in PAC 12 Conference standings that’s considered the best Division 1 women’s golf conference. Currently, Southern California is ranked as No. 1 and three other PAC 12 schools in the Top 10 nationally. Recruiting is a challenge for Coach Kelly with Colorado not having as much good golfing weather in the spring as PAC 12 schools on the West Coast and in Arizona. However, she has successfully recruited one of Colorado’s best high school golfers for next year’s team, Victoria Glenn of Valor Christian (Highlands Ranch). Coach Kelly also talked about the challenges of working with her team to improve their skills since NCAA regulations permit golf coaches a maximum of 8 hours per week with a golfer, of which 2 hours can be involved in actual teaching. After Coach Kelly graduated from TCU and was a LPGA golfer from 1984-1990 (having several top-20 finishes), CU hired her in 1997 to lead the CU Women’s Golf program.

### **Update on June 10 Foothills Benefit Golf Tourney**

Our Foothills Kiwanis “Dog Days” Benefit Golf Tournament is just one week away! The goal of our tournament this year is to raise \$10,000 for distribution to three worthy recipients who reflect our Kiwanis International motto of “Serving the Children of the World”. These recipients are --

- Boulder Attention Homes (\$4500) to pay for a media room equipment/furniture that will be used by teens in our community at Attention Home’s new Boulder facility
- Our club’s Alert Dog Program (\$2000), which trains service dogs to protect children with severe allergy issues and other medical conditions; and
- Kiwanis International “Eliminate Project” (\$3500), which prevents babies in poor countries from contracting the deadly Maternal Neonatal Tetanus (MNT) disease that results in death seven days after a baby is born.
